- deliberately influences the development of the whole school learning culture
- works to develop a shared understanding of pedagogical excellence
- ensures teachers are knowledgeable about current learning theories and develop strategies to optimise learning experiences for students



Curriculum

A current curriculum designed to develop:

- successful, confident and creative individuals
- deep knowledge, understanding, skills and values
- advanced learning and an ability to create new ideas and translate them into practical applications



Teaching

Teaching and pedagogy that is:

- authentic, purposeful and meaningful to students
- informed by research
- flexibly designed to nurture the learning abilities of all learners
- inclusive of authentic, rich and varied assessment that provides relevant, useful feedback for learners



Community

A professional learning community where leaders and teachers:

- develop a shared vision of teaching and learning excellence
- commit to ongoing learning to further develop their expertise
- share with each other their thinking, practice, programs and responses to student issues
- identify areas affecting student learning
- work collaboratively to implement effective interventions
