



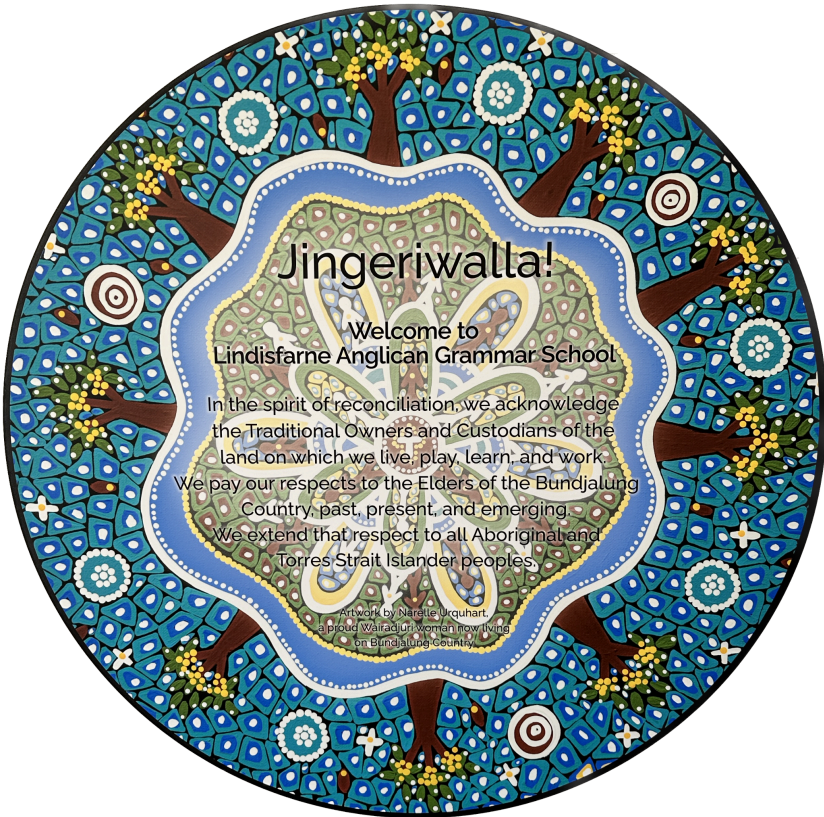

as we help each other.

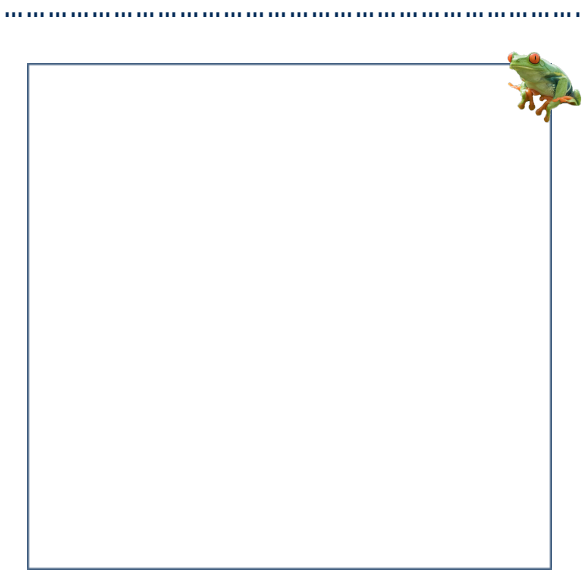

This is what I need to bring to school

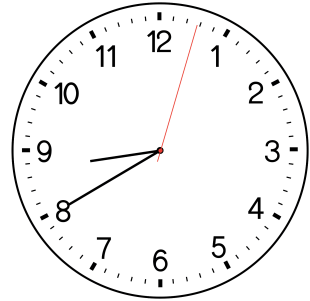
- My school bag
